Second Reading 1 Timothy 2: 1-7

The pastoral epistles offer insight into how early Christians understood many practical matters, such as church administration and worship. The church's focused prayer for others is an expression of the single-minded passion God has toward us in Jesus.



Gospel Luke 16: 1-13

Jesus tells the curious story of a dishonest manager who cheats his employer and then is commended by him for having acted so shrewdly. Jesus wonders why his own followers are less creative and diligent in their stewardship given that they are managers of a far more valuable household.

P The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Luke, the 16th chapter. C Glory to you, O Lord.

¹Then Jesus said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. ²So he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Give me an accounting of your management, because you cannot be my manager any longer.' ³Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he asked the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' ⁶He answered, 'A hundred jugs of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' ⁷Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' 8And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. ⁹And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes. ¹⁰"Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. ¹¹If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? ¹³No slave can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."

TWO MORE WEEKS TO DONATE FOR IN-GATHERING, which will be held on **October 4 and 5.** Workshop continues to sew quilts, school bags, and pack personal care kits, and sewing kits for Lutheran World Relief. **Donations of needed items** to put in the kits are welcome! **Green tubs labeled W/ELCA DONATIONS** have been placed in the Breezeway and in Nave and Chapel Narthexes to collect donations. **Items needed for School Bags include:** 70 sheet spiral bound notebooks, rulers with inches and centimeters, pencil sharpeners, black or blue ball point pens, Crayons (16 or 24 count), 2.5" erasers, and unsharpened pencils. **Items needed for Personal Care Kits include:** nail clippers, towels (thin 52"X 27" dark color preferred), large tooth combs (not picks), toothbrushes, and individually wrapped bars of soap. **Items needed for Sewing Kits:** fabric (60" – 2 1/4 yd., 42"-45" – 3 yd., 34-37" – 4 yd.) and matching or neutral color thread (250 – 300 yds). **Monetary donations** to help with the cost of shipping the needed items are also welcome! women's Shelter update: This year we were fortunate enough to expand our Women's Winter Shelter service into a year round effort. A goal of the shelter has been to not only provide the warmth and rest for their bodies, but also their hearts and minds. The shelter has made building community and hope a priority. Game nights, theme nights, dinners and more have provided a communal environment that offered hope to our community's vulnerable. The shelter has faced challenges, having been

forced to close multiple times due to the presence of bed bugs. We have worked with PennPest and others to determine how we can help prevent them, and one of the main steps is replacing the cots and beds the women sleep on. Our current cots are designed in a way that creates space for bugs to hide. The good news is that there are other beds available that are not only bed bug resistant, but also waterproof and fire repellent. To help transform the shelter space, we are working to replace the current cots with these new beds. We are excited to share that 11 of the 26 beds needed for the Women's Shelter have already been gifted! Each bed costs approximately \$300. 


