

Church World Service Request for Assistance

All refugee resettlement organizations received a stop-work order a few weeks ago. This stop-work order is affecting refugees who are already here in the US: people who have been extensively vetted by the US government and have been legally resettled in this country. Refugee status takes years to acquire and is one of the most difficult statuses to obtain. In fiscal year 2024, Church World Service Harrisburg resettled 611 refugees in the greater Harrisburg area. They were set to settle 850 refugees in fiscal year 2025. Since October 2024, CWS Harrisburg resettled 400 people prior to January 20.

Since the stop-work order, CWS has not been able to offer the mandated services refugees are supposed to receive because there has been a freeze on their federal income. In addition, work that was already done in December 2024 and submitted for reimbursement is included in this freeze, so the contracts that were fulfilled are not being paid by the federal government. As a result, they were massive furloughs, going from a staff of 54 people to 11 people. This has cut into the mandated services programs and affected refugees that have been resettled in this area.
