

Second Reading

Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16

Abraham and Sarah exemplify the vision of faith that people of God enact in every age. Their hope and trust in God's promise allowed them to face an unknown future and to receive the promise of God.

A A reading from Hebrews.

¹Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ²Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. ³By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

⁸By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. ⁹By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. ¹¹By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old—and Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. ¹²Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

¹³All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, ¹⁴for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.



From the Broader Church and Community

ELCA ELECTS NEW PRESIDING BISHOP: The Rev. Yehiel Curry was elected July 30 to serve a six-year term as presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The election took place during the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, held July 28 through August 2 in Phoenix. Bishop Curry was elected on the fifth ballot. There were 799 votes cast, with 400 votes needed for an election. He is the first Black presiding bishop of the ELCA. While a member of Shekinah Chapel in Riverside, Illinois, Bishop Curry he participated in the Theological Education for Emerging Ministries program, which prepares individuals for ordained ministry in the ELCA, with a focus on emerging ministry contexts like ethnic-specific, multicultural, rural and inner-city settings. He has served as bishop of the ELCA Metropolitan Chicago Synod since 2019. Bishop Curry previously served as mission developer (2009-2012) and pastor (2012-2019) of Shekinah. He received a Bachelor of Arts from Lewis University in Romeoville, Ill., in 1995 and a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (LSTC) in 2013.

CHRISTIAN CHURCHES UNITED GOLF TOURNAMENT UPDATE: It has been 2 months since we gathered at Sunset Golf Course for a beautiful day of golf! You helped raise of \$16,000 that day to support individuals experiencing homelessness and poverty. Your support and presence at the Golf Tournament has accomplished much within our community. We've been able to celebrate 2 individuals graduating from HELP's Rapid Rehousing Program in that time. In the last two months **20+ people** received support at Loads of Love. A family whose child is utilizes a heart monitor was prevented from losing power at their home. We have helped *prevent* homelessness for **51 households** through different Rental Assistance Programs.
