

Family Promise Update



August 10 through 17 was Family Promise Host Week. We partnered with Our Saviour Lutheran Church and hosted the guests at Our Saviour. The guests spent their day at the Day Center and were transported to the church at 6:00 p.m. in the Family Promise van where they received a hot meal and spent the night before returning to the Day Center in the morning. Morning departure vary with work and school bus schedules.

This was a very challenging week because we had several volunteers who became ill and were not able to help, and on Friday the van was to have an oil change, but had other problems as well and was taken out of service. Because we had 8 guests, a regular mini-van was not sufficient, and some volunteers were needed to transport some guests in their personal cars.

This week we hosted 3 adults, 2 teenagers, and 3 small children ages 4, 18 months and 10 weeks!

A HUGE thank you to everyone who helped either by driving the van, preparing a meal, or staying overnight. We are very grateful for all of you and the help you provided. The guests were very kind and appreciative and told us constantly and thanked us for all we did for them.

We received "thank you" notes from both families. They are posted with pictures of the children on the Family Promise Bulletin Board in the Breezeway.

We have been busy packing items for School Kits and Personal Care Kits for In-Gathering which will be held the weekend of October 4-5. **Thank you** so much for the donations that have come in and are still very much needed. We pack boxes each week, based on the supplies that come to us. **Back to School sales** are on right now. We try to take advantage of sales whenever we can. A complete list of needed items can be found elsewhere in this newsletter. Donations may be placed in the green tubs in the Breezeway and the Chapel and Nave Narthexes.

Here's how YOU can help with In-Gathering:

- · Come and join us on a Tuesday morning and help us pack!
- **Monetary donations** to help with the cost of shipping the needed items are welcome! Look for blue envelopes in the Narthex and outside of the Chapel closer to In-Gathering.
- **Donations of needed items** to put in the kits are also welcome!



Items needed for School Bags include: 70 sheet spiral bound notebooks (currently \$.35 at Target and \$.40 at Walmart and Staples), rulers with inches and centimeters, pencil sharpeners, black or blue ball point pens, Crayons (16 or 24 count), 2.5" erasers, and unsharpened pencils

Items needed for Personal Care Kits include: nail clippers, towels (thin 52"X 27" dark color preferred), large tooth combs (not picks), Toothbrushes, and individually wrapped bars of soap



Items needed for Sewing Kits: fabric (60" - 21/4 yd.), 42"-45" - 3 yd., 34-37" - 4 yd.) and matching or neutral color thread 250 - 300 yds.

Christian Churches United Golf Tournament Update

It has been 2 months since we gathered at Sunset Golf Course for a beautiful day of golf! \$16,000 was raised that day to support individuals experiencing homelessness and poverty. Your support and presence at the Golf Tournament has accomplished much within our community. We've been able to celebrate 2 individuals graduating from HELP's Rapid Rehousing Program in that time. In the last two months 20+ people received support at Loads of Love. A family whose child is utilizes a heart monitor was prevented from losing power at their home. We have helped *prevent* homelessness for 51 households through different Rental Assistance Programs. Thank you! NOTE: Two foursomes from Good Shepherd participated in the tournament.
